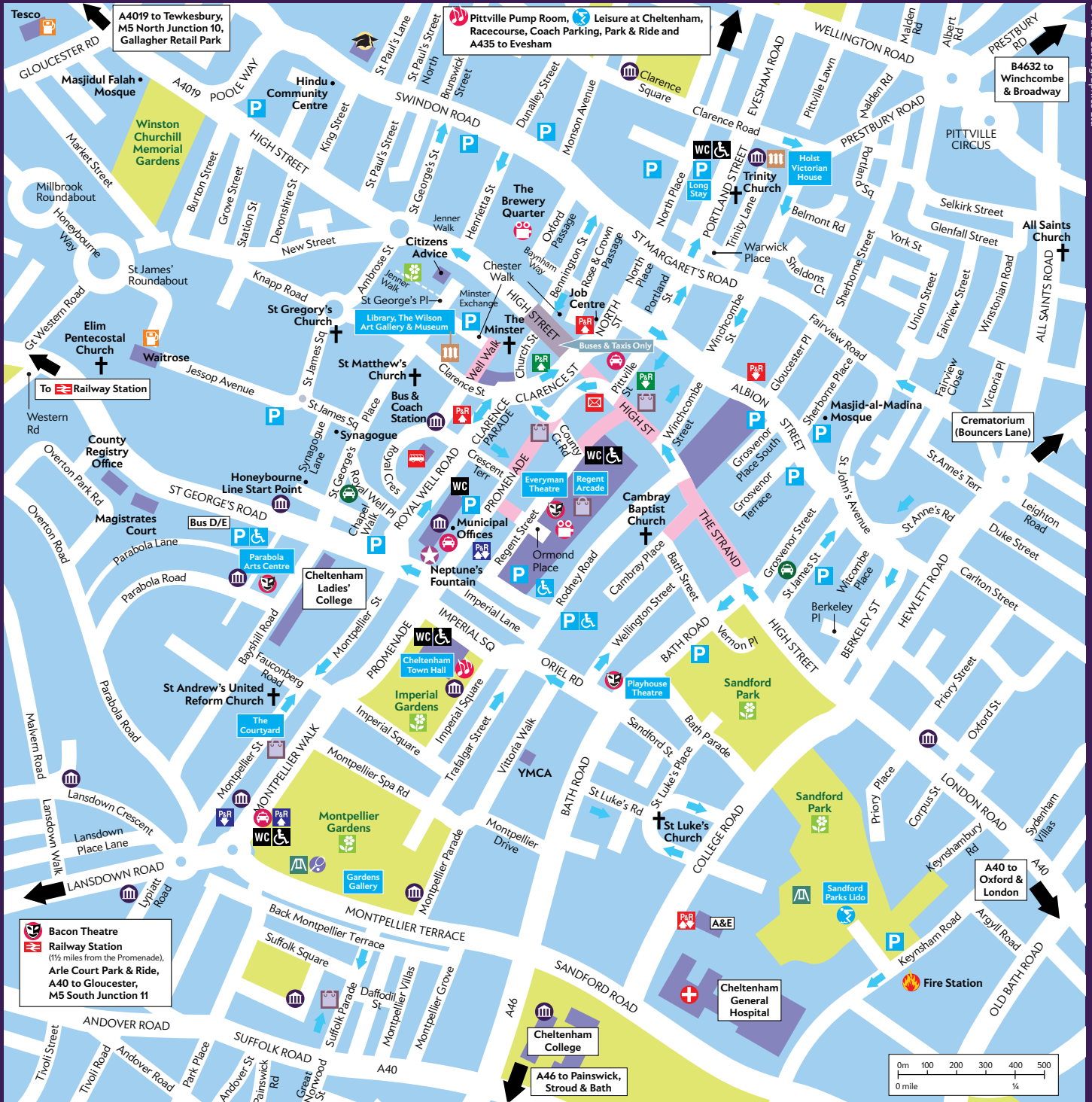


CHELTENHAM INNER MAP

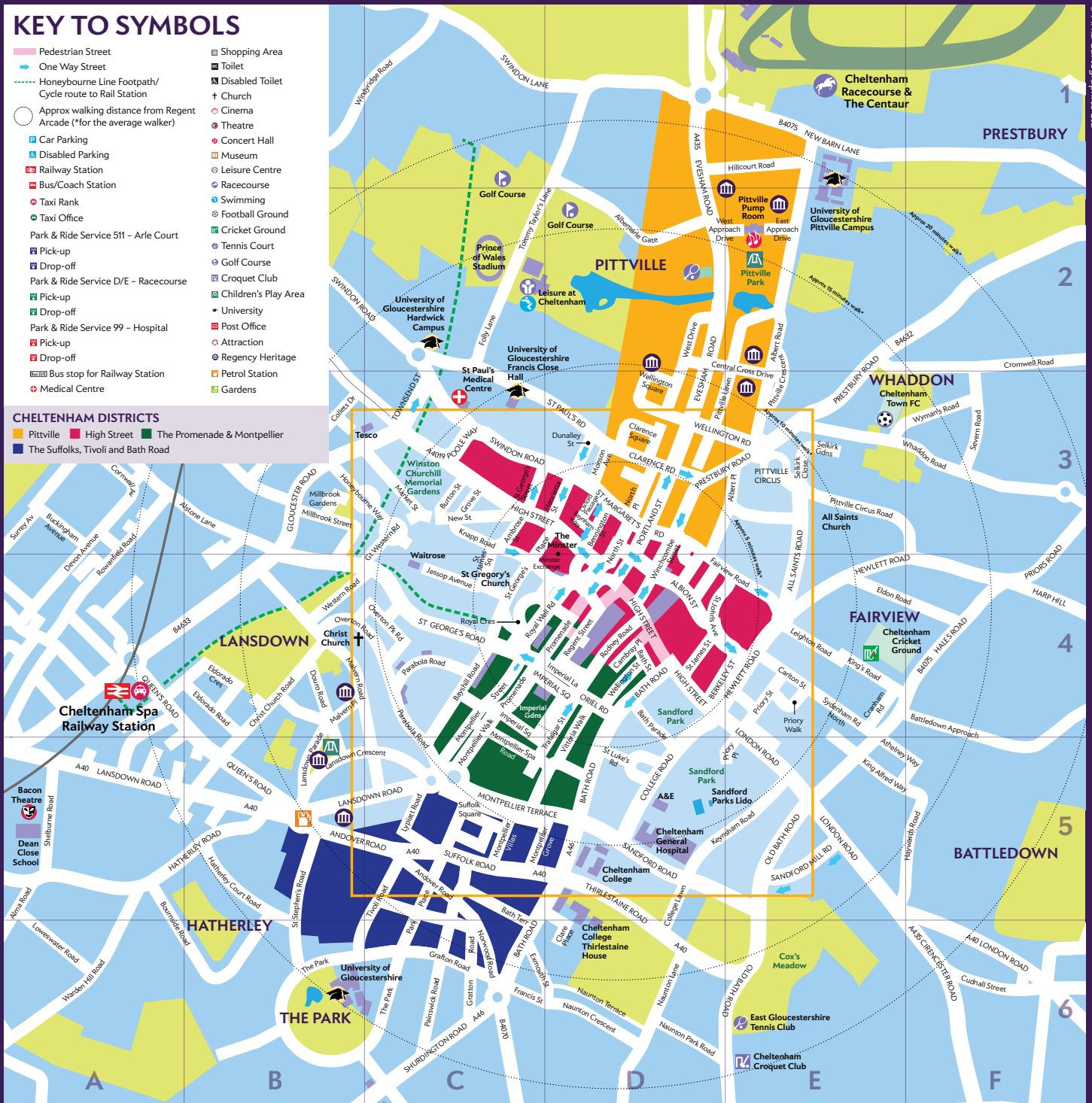

EXPLORE OUR DISTRICTS

PITTVILLE

Pittville Park is the largest ornamental park in Cheltenham, featuring the magnificent **Pittville Pump Room** (map ref E2), which is the only place in Cheltenham where you can still try the spa waters that made Cheltenham famous in the 18th century. Don't miss the Boating Lake (map ref D2) and children's play area (map ref E2). **Cheltenham Racecourse** (map ref E1) is nearby. **Holst Victorian House** (map ref D3) is an interesting re-creation of Victorian life in Cheltenham and gives the opportunity to see the piano on which Gustav Holst composed 'The Planets'.

HIGH STREET

Cheltenham's High Street (map ref C/D 3/4) is the best place to discover national brands. It is also the home of indoor shopping centre, the **Regent Arcade** (map ref D4) where children will love the Wishing Fish Clock, with its music and bubbles on the strike of each hour.

At the end of High Street you will find **The Brewery Quarter** (map ref D3) where you will find the cinema, bowling and indoor golf and a soft play area for kids, in addition to many well-known restaurants and bars.

Don't miss Bennington Street (map ref D3), home to independent retailers and cafés.

Visit **The Wilson Art Gallery & Museum** (map ref D4), to find out more about Cheltenham's history and see its many exhibitions including an internationally important designated collection of the British Arts and Crafts movement.

THE PROMENADE & MONTPELLIER

During the day, this area has a continental feel, with many independent and upmarket shops and cafés (map ref C/D 4/5). In the evening you will find a vibrant atmosphere with bars, restaurants and night clubs.

The Promenade (map ref C/D4) is a beautiful tree-lined shopping street that leads from the High Street to Montpellier.

Montpellier Gardens (map ref C5) has tennis courts, a children's play area and skate park as well as a small arboretum.

Just off the Promenade you'll find one of Cheltenham's entertainment venues, the **Town Hall** (map ref C4).

THE SUFFOLKS & TIVOLI

This area has some great independent shops, pubs and restaurants. The pretty Regency area takes its name from the Earl of Suffolk, who owned much of the land in the early 19th century. The Suffolks (map ref C5) and Tivoli (map ref B/C5) have become popular for antiques, homeware and individual specialist shops as well as restaurants.

The Suffolks community has regular events, closing the streets for food markets and live music.
